**SECTION 4: First aid measures**

**4.1. Description of first aid measures**

General Advice	Remove contaminated clothing immediately and dispose of safely.
First-aid measures after inhalation	Move the victim to fresh air and keep at rest. Call a physician or poison control centre immediately.
First-aid measures after skin contact	Immediately wash with plenty of soap and water for at least 15 minutes. Warm water may increase the subjective severity of the irritation/paresthesia. <b>4.3. Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed</b>	
	Risks This product contains a pyrethroid. Pyrethroid poisoning should not be confused with carbamate or organophosphate poisoning.  Systemic treatment: Initial treatment: symptomatic. Monitor: respiratory and cardiac functions. In case of ingestion gastric lavage should be considered in cases of significant ingestions only within the first 2 hours. However, the application of activated charcoal and sodium sulphate is always advisable. Keep respiratory tract clear. Oxygen or artificial respiration if needed. In case of convulsions, a benzodiazepine (e.g. diazepam) should be given according to standard regimens. If not effective, phenobarbital may be used. Contraindication: atropine. Contraindication: derivatives of adrenaline. There is no specific antidote. Recovery is spontaneous and without sequelae.
